

Mindframes survey

You may wish to find out how your students perceive you in relation to the Visible Learning mindframes. The table below shows some possible prompts you could use. The left-hand column shows the link to the mindframes – you wouldn't need to include this when you survey the students, but this might help your analysis.

Analysis

The mindframes that I seem to show most strongly are related to challenge – I got the highest percentages for the prompts “My teacher challenges me” and “My teacher helps me achieve things I didn't think I could.” Eighty percent of students also agreed that “My teacher encourages me to concentrate and stick to things even when it is hard.”

In terms of areas that I think I most urgently need to work on, 60% of students disagree that “My teacher has conversations with me (they don't just talk ‘at’ me)” and the same number disagreed that “My teacher thinks that everyone can learn.” I think that this means that I really need to work on increasing the amount of dialogue in the classroom – I think I probably do dominate the talk in the class. I also need to work on how I make sure that the high levels of challenge I'm setting are accompanied by a belief that all students can succeed.
